TR6 REBUILD (aka Naughty Girl)

I started this project 7 years ago. It has had 3 differentials, 3 transmissions and 4 engines, and has not left the frame dolly. Differentials have been, the stock TR6, a 4.1 R200 and last a 3.2 R200 posi. Transmissions have been a T5 ford, .72 O/D, a Camaro .63 O/D and last to be installed a 4L60E automatic from a Camaro. Engines have been a 3.4L IH out of a Camaro insurance write off, a crate 3.4L, a 3400 FWD from a Venture and last a 3500 from a G6 with only 3600 mi. on it. This is my first 3500 I have done, I was amazed how many changes there are between a 3400 and a 3500, the turning to a RWD was not a easy task, I am looking forward to the performance differences between the two engines.

The frame is in the shop and the car is my main project till completion. I want to take it to San Diego in Oct., For the readers who are on Facebook weekly photo's are on Sinner Performance David will keep it updated, also Joe from JCVDUDE on You Tube is doing a start to finish video of the project, Joe has videoed a few of my cars over the last few years. Since I am upgrading I will go through the changes I have done and talk about the upgrades.

Starting at the rear I made new hubs using Nissan 280 axles and custom built hubs, I did this 7yrs. ago and took about 3 months to do, I also built Diff mounts to hold the Nissan R200. This was not a cost efficient way. Now we can buy readymade units, both hubs and mounts, uprated springs were also \P added. The other thing I made was rear disc brakes, I have made a lot of these over the past few years. I installed KYB shocks from British parts northwest and installed them inside the springs with rear sway 🍕 mounts welded into the A arm. I made my own adjustable brackets but changed to Richard Good. Now for the hard decision, what type of A arm bushings to use. There are 4 types to choose from, stock rubber type, hard poly, red Prothane and now the purple one's. This is my opinion on the first 3, the stock rubber are fine for the owner who is satisfied with show room handling, Black poly gives a firm ride and handles much better than stock bushings, they do wear oblong when you put a lot of miles on your car, the Red Prothane are much quieter and last longer than the black. I find they handle more than adequate for the average driver. I am taking out the red bushings and trying the Purple bushings from Moss Motors 🍕 to compare the difference in the products over a 3 year test. I do keep a log book on the service of parts. A little trick I do is file the top A arm bracket hole (3/8" bolt) oblong, this keeps the center line of the brackets in line and allows the bushings to wear even. I do find it really helps in handling when you have to adjust the A arms a lot to get Camber. The other thing I do is build a dropped bottom plate to allow a larger tube exhaust system. I hate rattles. I also boxed the diff and frame brackets. This covers the back section, I will get Dave to make sure he gets lots of pictures.

I have also been working on body changes. I will talk about them in my next update. I hope to have the engine and transmission installed also, with major changes to the front suspension. I have gained experience with injection delivery. I have to re-do the fuel supply system. If you have any questions let me know.

One last thing before I close, all my builds have a fun file name, this one is called **NAUGHTY GIRL** the next article will be called **Naughty Girl Article 2**.
