

# SPRING MOUNTAIN RANCH SUMMER THEATER Held Saturday, July 21st, 2012





# READING TAILPIPE SMOKE

If you have smoke coming out of your tailpipe as you travel down the road, you should be concerned. Depending on what color the smoke is, usually is a telltale sign of what's wrong with your engine and is usually the source of the problem. The more miles you drive a smoking car, the worse the problem gets and it will end up costing you more bucks in the end. The following is only a general guideline for diagnosing exhaust pipe smoke. The list is not meant to be a comprehensive one covering all reasons for smoke signals coming from your tailpipe:

**BLUE / WHITE SMOKE:** While blue / black smoke points to an engine that is internally wearing out, blue / white smoke indicates that oil is being sucked into the combustion chambers through the valve guides. It's possible this problem can be fixed by replacing the valve seals.

**BLACK SMOKE:** Chances are your car is going to need some carburetor or fuel injection work. Your engine depends on a proper ratio of air / fuel mixture to run properly. There is a good chance fuel is entering the cylinders and is not being burned properly. You are probably "running rich" and are getting poor fuel mileage. **WHITE SMOKE:** If white smoke is coming out of your tailpipe and the exhaust smell is not normal, you could have a coolant leak into the combustion chambers. There are usually two reasons for this: A blown head gasket or a cracked cylinder head. Do not continue driving the car. You risk the chance of further overheating the engine causing more damage and costing you more money.

THICK WHITE SMOKE: Belching white smoke when starting the car could be a sign that transmission fluid

is entering the combustion chambers, perhaps through a vacuum tube that connects the engine to the transmission.

Thank you for having such a great club and thank you Jim for all the help...... Bill Debevo


# "THEY EXCEEDED MY EXPECTATIONS"

Seldom do I purchase a product or service that truly lives up to its promise. And I cannot recall ever buying a product or service that exceeded my expectations to the extent that I felt compelled to write an article praising it. Until now.

<u>Item #1:</u> <u>Turtlewax Ice Synthetic Liquid Car Polish</u> - I saw this advertised on TV this past week and, as my Pontiac was due for some love, I decided to try it. The instructions were pretty simple:

- A. Wash and dry the car.
- B. Apply a thin coat of Ice using the sponge applicator pad supplied.
- C. Remove the Ice with one side of the micro-fiber towel supplied.
- D. Turn the towel over and polish to a high gloss.



Now, at my age, waxing a car is not my favorite chore but I have to say that this Ice product is the absolute best wax I've ever used. As it is a liquid, it goes on easily and quickly. It dries in 3-5 minutes and is absolutely a cinch to take back off using the towel that comes with it. Turning the towel to the other side brings out an incredible shine. And, as the liquid is clear, there isn't a trace of residue left behind. No dust, no white powder, and no white stains on black plastic trim. It took me the better part of an hour to wash and dry my GTO. It took 45 minutes flat to wax it. I was so chuffed with the results, I got up this morning and washed and waxed Pilar's Altima. Again, it took me longer to wash and dry it then it did to wax it.

This product does not pretend to remove tar spots or any other foreign material on the paint - so you need to make certain the finish is free of tar and that sort of thing before starting. But, if your paint is in good shape, you will not believe the results using this product. I highly recommend it.

<u>Item #2:</u> <u>Dr. ColorChip Automotive Paint Chip Repair System</u> - You're probably as tired of this TV ad as I am - except for the young lady pitching the product. Pretty easy on the eyes. Anyhow, my GTO had several rock chips that I wanted to make go away so I ordered up the product online. The ordering process is as simple as pointing/clicking on the year, make and model of your car and the paint color code. I thought \$50 was a little steep and was skeptical if the product really worked as well as the TV ad showed. Well, I can tell you that it is worth every bit of \$50 and it works just like the ad shows.

You wipe a little rubbing alcohol on the chip to clean out any old wax. After applying a dab of the paint next to the chip, you smooth over the blob of paint using your finger covered by the glove supplied in the kit. After letting the paint flash off for 3-5 minutes you apply a little of the blending liquid with the special cloth supplied and lightly rub the paint until the excess is removed and the painted chip is flat. Immediately, you take the second cloth supplied and polish the painted area. The results are so good that it is impossible to see where the chip was. And, if you pressed too hard and you can still see the outline of the chip, you simply repeat the process. A light touch works best. I filled in every paint chip on my car in less than 1/2 hour and could not be more pleased with the results. I also highly recommend this product.
